All Saints Wokingham - Letter to Parents

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you and your families are well. As there have been a number of developments at All Saints during the past half term, I am writing to update you on these and share some plans for the next half term.

Firstly, I would like to introduce myself as the new Chair of Governors at All Saints. As we are a Church of England Voluntary Aided School, The Oxford Diocesan Board of Education (ODBE) has always worked intensively in partnership with Wokingham Council to support All Saints. Following the Ofsted inspection in September 2021, this support has intensified and focused on leadership and governance. In addition, our associate membership of the Frays Multi Academy Trust (MAT) has brought external expertise to the school to improve the quality of education for all our pupils. Most recently, ODBE and Wokingham Council have sought to boost the capacity of the governing body by appointing experienced educational professionals including myself as governors. As there was an existing vacancy for the post of Chair, I felt called to take on this role at this important stage in the school's journey. At the same time, a number of governors felt that this was an appropriate time to step down. I am grateful for the service they have given to the school; in some cases, this has been over many years.

Secondly, following the decision of Mrs Stanton to retire at the end of the current academic year, the new look governing body have been active in planning and developing the process to recruit a new headteacher for September. With the support of Wokingham Council, they have prepared an application pack and selection process that we are confident will enable us to recruit the best possible headteacher to lead All Saints from September. The post will be advertised in early March, and we hope to be able to appoint our new head before Easter. I will of course keep you updated on this process during the next half term.

Thirdly, governors are in the process of consulting on the proposal to become an academy and join the Frays MAT from September. As part of this process, we have already provided an opportunity to meet with parents and carers on a virtual platform. Given the reduction of Covid-19 cases and the significant developments at All Saints that I have outlined, we would like to provide a further opportunity to meet in person. We would like to invite all parents and carers to meet at the school on Thursday 3rd March at 6.30pm for an in person meeting to discuss the academisation proposal and to meet the new members of the governing body.

Finally, it only remains for me to wish all our school community a very pleasant break and I look forwards to seeing many of you after half-term.
