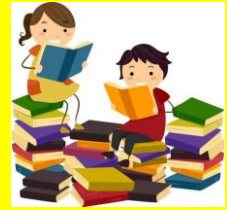


## Reading

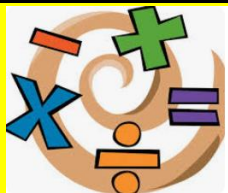


## Spelling

Make a list of appliances that use electricity and sort them into different rooms.</p>	<p>Investigate which objects in your home are powered by batteries and which use mains electricity. Record your findings.</p>
<p><b>I enjoy painting, drawing and being hands-on</b></p>	<p>Design a timeline showing 5 important events in Wokingham's history.</p>	<p>Draw a Tudor house</p>
<p><b>I enjoy being active.</b></p>	<p>Go on a walk around your local area and look for signs of Wokingham's history. Take notes or sketches of what you find..</p>	<p>Complete a "Times Table Fitness Challenge" – do a star jump, squat or hop for each answer in a times table you are practising.</p>
