


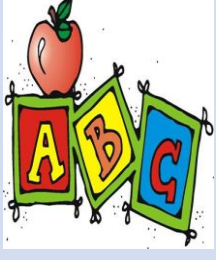

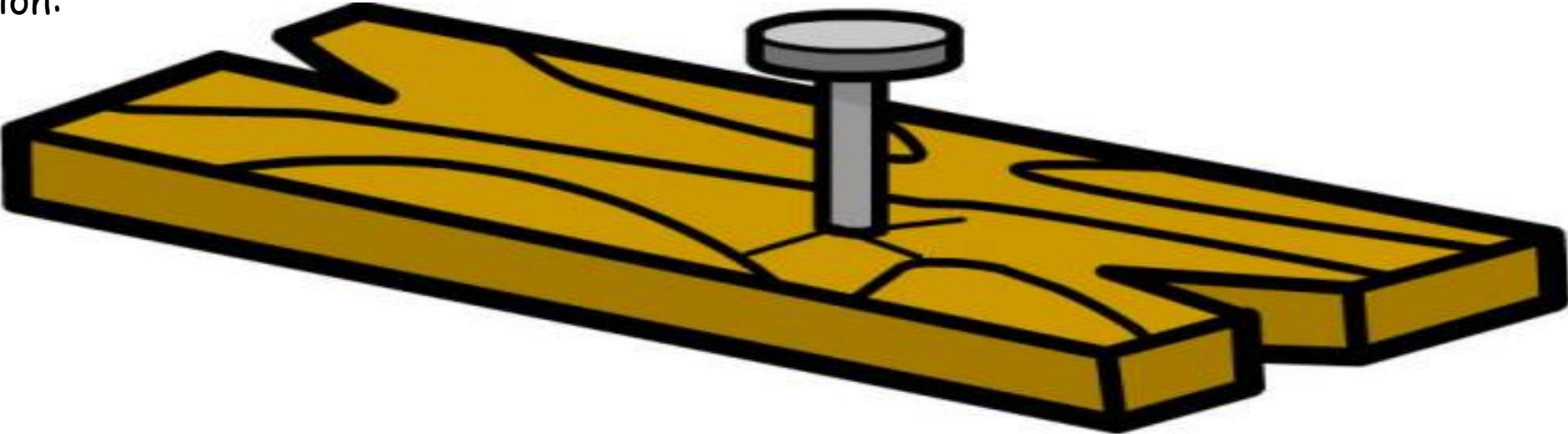

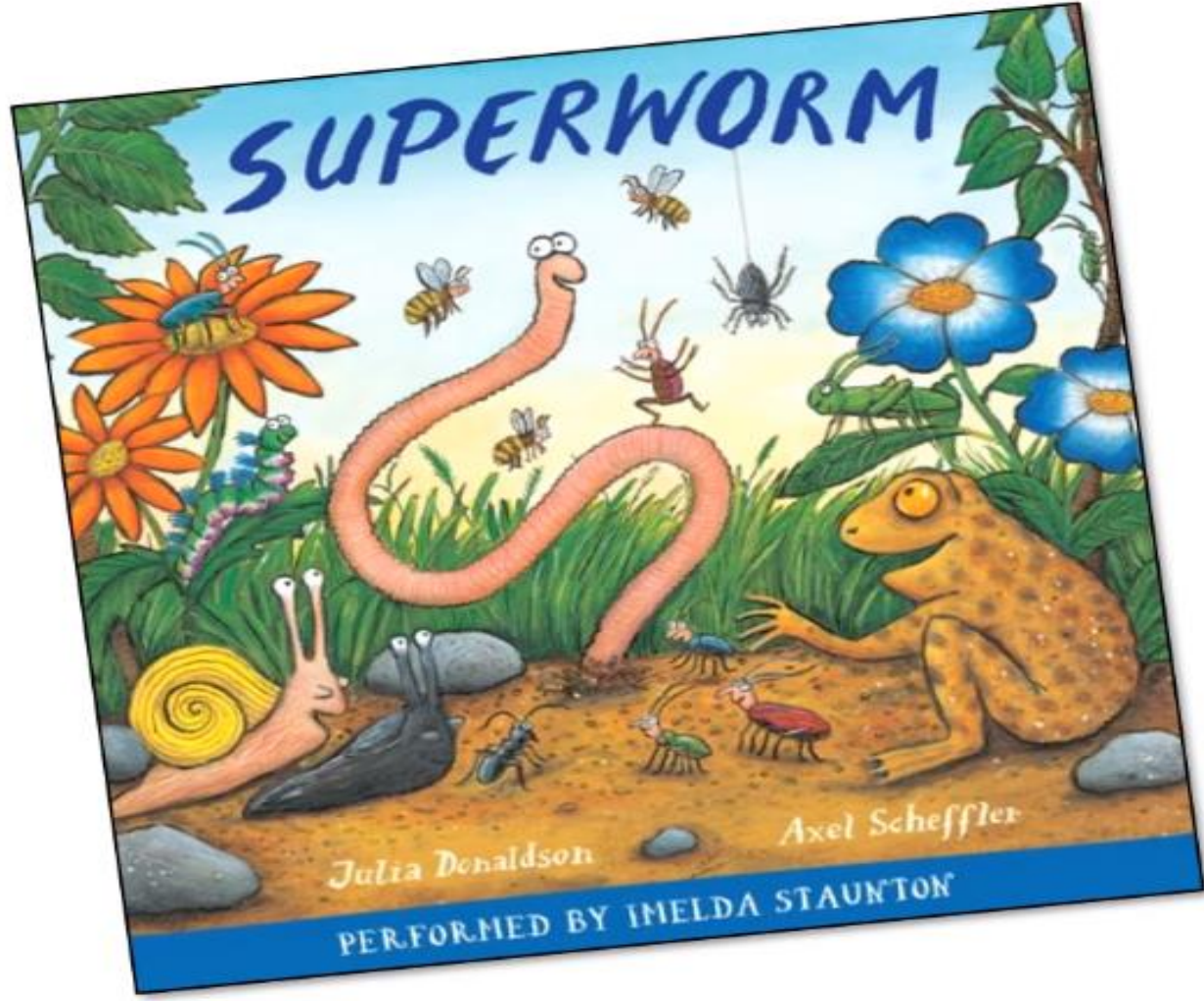

## Worm painting patterns.

Use your “Superworm” skills to make symmetrical art works. Explore what length your worm needs to be to make more complex patterns and the effects he makes!



## Talking Together

Spoiler alert... we will not use real worms!



You will need:

Paper, paint in different colours and some string/wool.

Fold your paper in half to see the middle line.

Open it back up.

Cut your lengths of string to different lengths - making sure there is enough for you to keep hold of it when inbetween the paper.

Take a piece of string, dunk it in the paint leaving an end free of paint to hold on to.

If you don't have paint you could always use playdough to create different sized worms!

### Talking Together

Superworm is super-long. Superworm is super-strong. Watch him wiggle see him squirm.  
Hip Hip Hurray for Superworm!

Next lay the paint covered string on one side of the folded paper in any pattern, leaving the clean end of the string out.

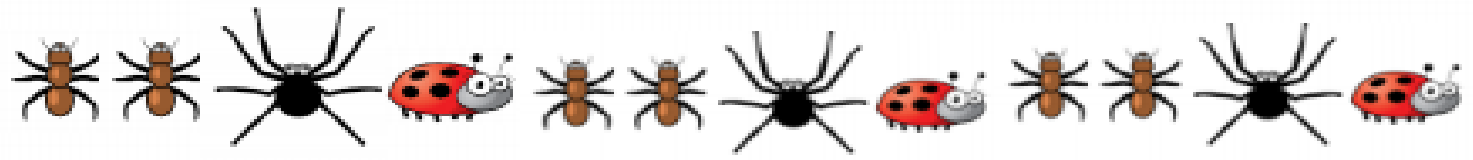
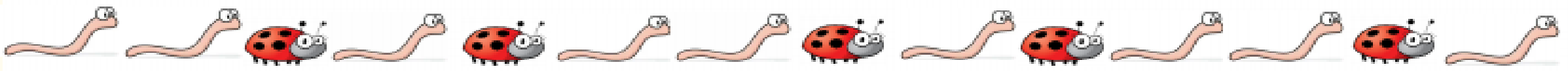
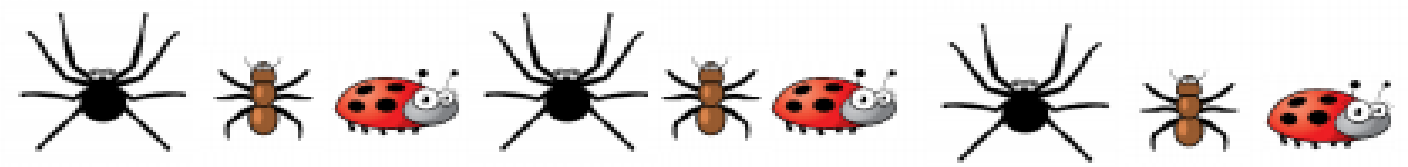
Then fold the paper back together and put your hand on the paper so you can feel the string through the paper and begin pulling the string out moving it around the edges of the paper.

(Remember to join in with the Superworm chant! )

It's really fun to have more than one string with different colours. Pull the strings out and open up the paper and ta da! A super creation!

Can a grown up time you? Check your counting!

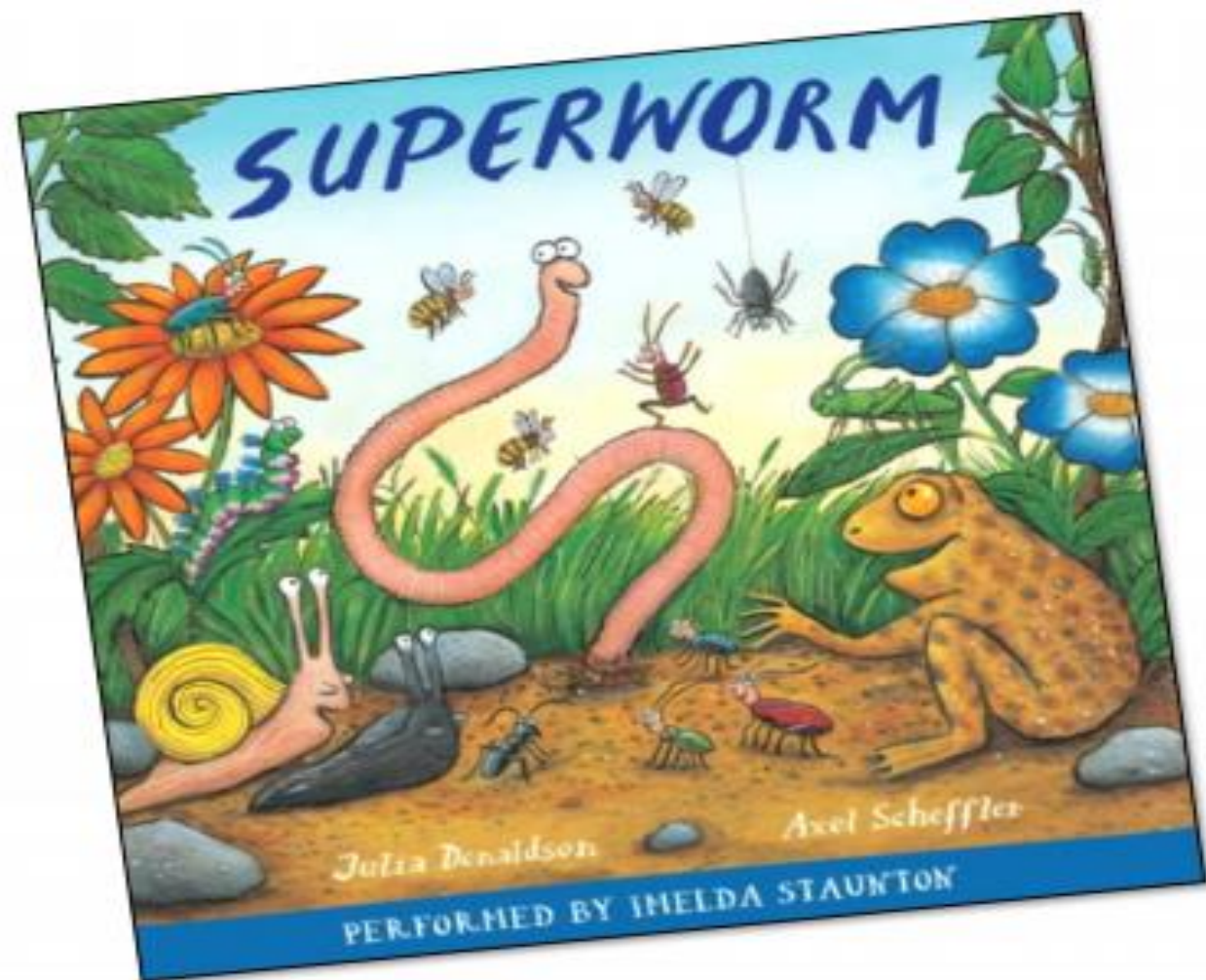
How else can you move your body like Superworm.

### Talking Together

Pick your tin!

Look at making labels and think about the amount that will be in that tin! If you draw around the old label then you can get the exact size.

Pick your minibeast contents. Are there going to be just one minibeast in a can? Make labels as fancy as you want!

(Grown ups you might want to mark the tin with what is really in it!)

What about half a tin of worms and a tin of slugs? Look at different combinations.



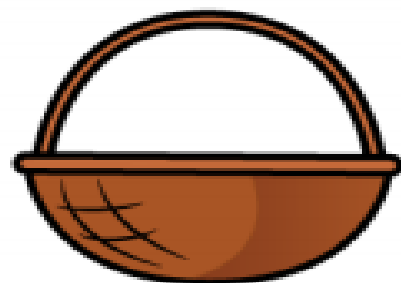
## Talking Together

## Talking Together



Of course we are not going to cut real worms!

Grown ups cook some spaghetti until almost cooked and then rinse under cold water. You can add food colouring to make them any colour you want if you want fancy worms!

Play the worm making game!

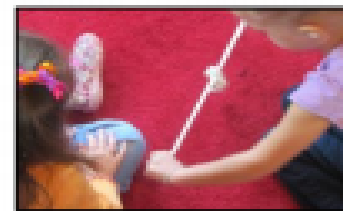
## Talking Together

You will need two people and some long wool/thread or string.

Cut your string into worm sized pieces (not too short)



Hide worms around the house.



The game 3 2 1 go .....

Set off hunting for bits of worm and come back to the same place. Tie your pieces together.

The winner is the person with the longest worm!

To make it harder use 2 colours of string and you have to find your own colour.

If you struggle to tie knots use some sticky tape!

<p>Go on a nature walk scavenger hunt - use the sheet provided or make your own! You could take the scavenger hunt to different places to compare and contrast.</p>	<p>Find a picture of your favourite animal/sea creature/ mini beast - Write some describing words to go with it. You can then include these words in a sentence to describe the creature.</p>	<p>Design a poster about sun safety - what do we need to stay safe in the sun? Why should we stay safe in the sun?</p>
<p>Use a paper plate to make some under the sea creatures. You could use lots of different materials to create different effects - try bubble wrap, tin foil and fabrics!</p>	<p>Design and make a boat! Use what you know about materials that float to create your own boat! Write some instructions to help your friends make one too.</p>	<p>Use hot and cold water to dissolve different solids - sand, coffee, sugar, loose tea, hot chocolate. Which solids dissolve and which don't? Make a chart to record what you have found.</p>
<p>Can you make a sea creature that moves? Explore the different materials you could use - split pins, string, elastic bands.</p>	<p>Create a fact file about your favourite creature. Include: what it eats, its habitat, its predators, what it looks like and a special fact.</p>	<p>Make a bird feeder - there are lots of different ways to do this! Research what birds like to eat online and create your own.</p>
