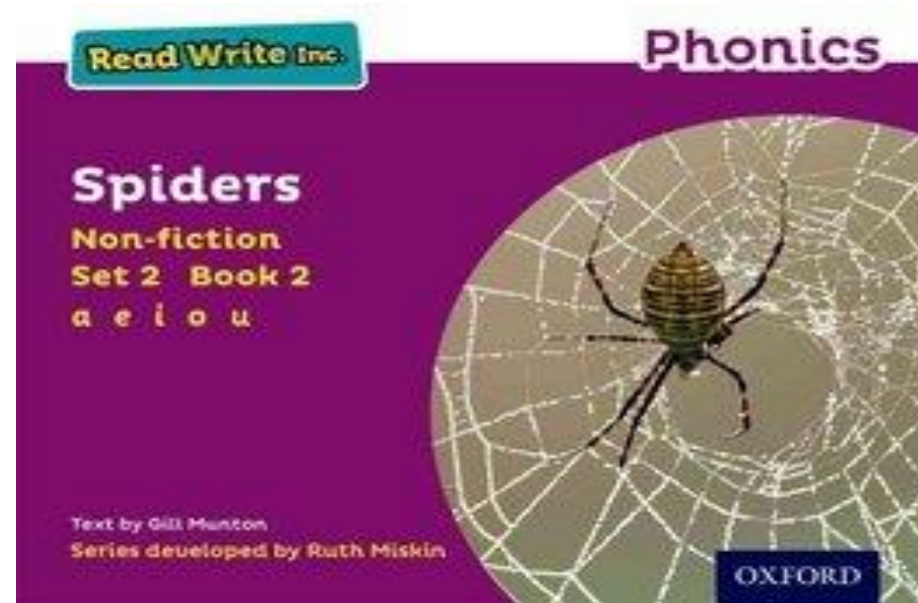

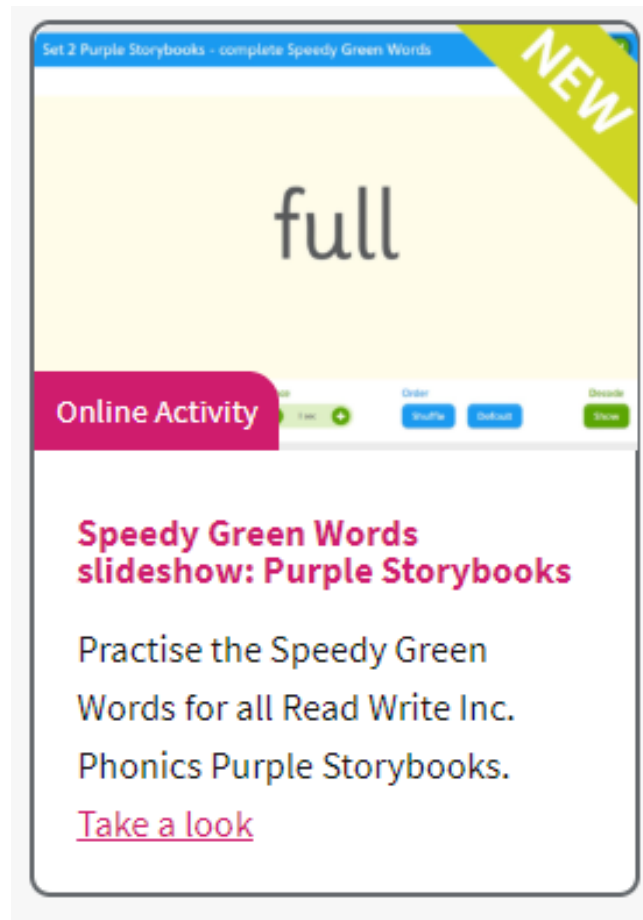

Speed Sounds

Consonants Ask children to say the sounds.

Each box contains one sound but sometimes more than one grapheme.
Focus graphemes for this story are **circled**.



Vowels Ask children to say the sounds in and out of order.

Story Green Words



Ask children to read the words first in *Find Talk* and then say the word.

chest silk web plant crack insect
trap stuck kept sac when hatch

Ask children to say the syllables and then read the whole word.

ab|do|men

Ask children to read the root first and then the whole word with the suffix.

spin → spins egg → eggs



Vocabulary Check



Discuss the meaning (as used in the non-fiction text) after the children have read the word.

definition

abdomen	<i>the part of the body where the stomach is</i>
silk	<i>a very fine, strong thread</i>
sac	<i>a thin pouch for holding eggs</i>
hatch	<i>when a baby creature comes out of its egg</i>

Red Words

Ask children to practise reading the words across the rows, down the columns and in and out of order clearly and quickly.

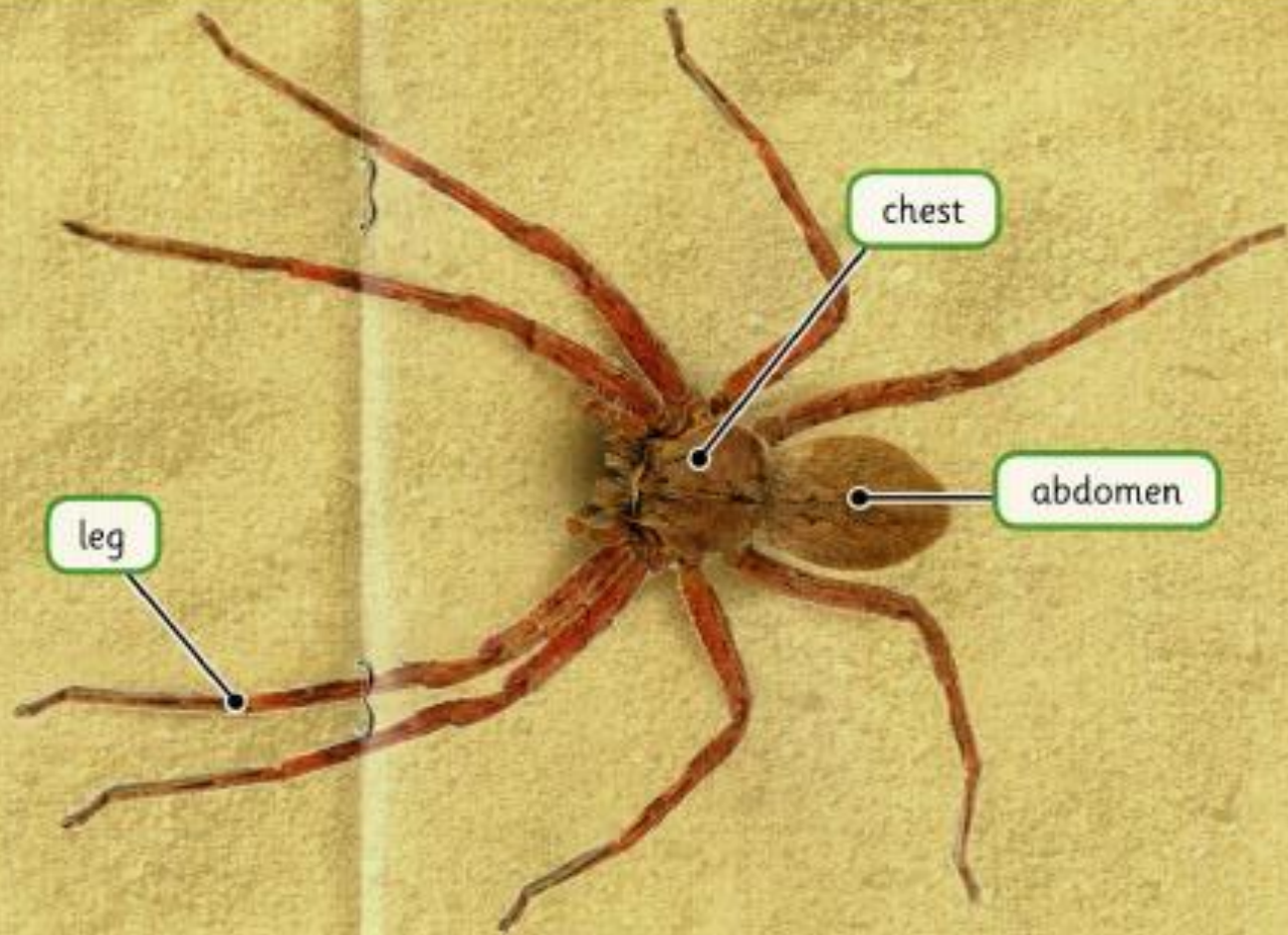

Let's look at spiders!



A spider has:

- 8 legs
- a chest
- an abdomen.



A **spider** spins a silk web.



It can **be** on a plant
or in a crack.



The web is an insect trap.



Insects get stuck in it and then the spider can catch them.



Up to 250 spider eggs
are kept in an egg sac.



When the eggs hatch, spiderlings
run out.



Questions to talk about

Ask children to TTYP for each question using 'Fastest finger' (FF) or 'Have a think' (HaT).

- p.10 (FF) How many legs does a spider have?
- p.12 (FF) What does a spider spin?
- p.13 (FF) Where can you find a spider web?
- pp.14–15 (HaT) Why is a spider web useful?
- p.16 (FF) Where are spider eggs kept?
