E-safety is an important part of keeping our children safe at All Saints. We teach all pupils to stay safe and behave appropriately online. Here are some ideas of how you can help keep your children when using technology at home:

- At school we use the **smart** rules to help children remember how to keep safe; we suggest you use them at home too!

S - SAFE - Keep all your personal information such as your full name, address and passwords safe so that no one can find them. Also remember to log off the computer.

M - Meet - Never arrange to meet anyone online

A - Accept - Do not accept any requests or emails from people you don't know in real life. Just delete them or block them and tell an adult.

R - Reliable - Remember not everything you read on the internet is reliable.

T - TELL - **Most importantly tell a trusted adult if anything is worrying you.**
