

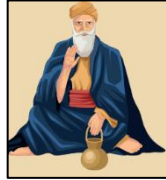

Equality is very important to Sikhs.

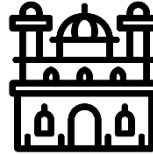


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“Ik Onkar”: “God is One; humanity is one.”
